## Our GOOD and LOVING Father ... the "3-R's"

# Repent + Rejoice + Receive

#### **Good Father**

Here is a true statement ... we are men, but we are also <u>sons</u>. Sons of an earthly father. Maybe you had a good dad; who cared for you, loved you for being you and blessed you as his son! Or, maybe your father was; absent, oppressive, hurtful, not loving, etc.. Either way, you are still a son of an earthly father. You did not select your dad. You dad was selected for you. Have you thought about this recently? Have you considered that you are also the son of the Heavenly Father? You and I have been adopted as sons by our Heavenly Father! Read verse 4 below from Ephesians. The <u>definition of sonship</u> is: The Greek word for adoption to sonship is a legal term referring to the full legal standing of an adopted male heir in Roman culture.

### **Ephesians 1** (NIV)

3 Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ. 4 For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love 5 he predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will— 6 to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he loves. 7 In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace 8 that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and understanding, 9 he[d] made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, 10 to be put into effect when the times reach their fulfillment—to bring unity to all things in heaven and on earth under Christ.

# **Scripture Reflection:**

- 1. Read **Luke 15: 1-7** ... out loud. Then ask; where *do you see the 3 R's?*
- 2. Read Luke 15: 8-10 ... out loud. Then ask; where do you see the 3 R's? (See below: REPENT)
- 3. Read Luke 15: 11-24 ... look again at these verses... do you see the 3 R's?
  - a. *v20-21 ... Repent*
  - b. v20 ..."He ran to his son. Threw his arms around him and kissed him" ...Rejoice
  - c. v22-24 ... best robe, ring, sandals, fattened calf, feast and celebrate! ... Receive

## WORK ROUND: Ask these questions to the men?

4. Think. Remember. When have <u>you experienced</u> the <u>love of the "GOOD FATHER" in your life?</u>

- 6. In YOUR faith life experience, when have you personally experienced the **3-R's (Repent + Rejoice + Receive)?** Write your response below;
  - a. Repented from what behavior or action? Note: if you are struggling to remember something, please read Luke 15: 32. Key words: "was dead and is alive again –or- was lost and is found"

b. <u>Rejoice</u> ... joy-Joy-JOY from Heaven to <u>you</u>! How did Heaven rejoice with you? How did you <u>feel</u> or <u>experience</u> this JOY? Was this joy <u>shared</u> with others (wife, friends, pastor, children, others?)? Specifically, recall details of "celebration"...

c. **Receive** ... Our Father's LOVE is so good, that it changes us (me). Now that you have received, how are you different?

### What does **REPENT** mean?

You may be surprised to learn the word <u>repent</u> in the Greek New Testament simply means to **turn** around. It was a military term that described a soldier marching in one direction and then doing an aboutface. And when it's used in a spiritual sense, it means to change your mind.

So really, repent is a perfect description of what happens when you come to Christ. You no longer reject Christ, but now you believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of the living God. You do a spiritual about-face, which in turn changes.

So should you be afraid of the word repent? No! Instead, embrace the idea of doing a spiritual about-face, turning to Christ and away from sin in your life!
